This emphasises the importance which the Church places on service. Jesus lived a life of service. Family and school life become more joyful when we follow Jesus' example and live as God intends.


So enjoy your week together - bring peace and joy into your home and community through **SERVING** each other.




READ & REFLECT! Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!

SHARE & CARE! Growing in Goodness & Love: This Wednesday's Word...

What matters to God is that we care for, love and serve one another. We show our greatness by serving others. Ask your child what 'serving each other' means to them.
